Activity Title: Harriet Beecher Stowe

Procedures:

Visit the website links listed above with the students to learn more about Harriet Beecher Stowe. Have the students watch the video about the impact that Harriet Beecher Stowe's novel, *Uncle Tom's Cabin*, had on the United States at the time. Then, read the poem with the students, or have them read it on their own. Next, have the students work in small groups to write an explanation for why they think Dunbar wrote this poem about Stowe. When the groups are finished, have them share what they wrote with the class.
