Story 16: "Flop Has a Tumble" Curly and Floppy Twistytail, the Funny Piggie Boys

Directions: Make a shape book. Write a summary of this story on the pages of your book. Include the beginning, middle, and the end. Add two supporting details or events to each part of the story. Illustrate your summary.

Materials: Letter size paper, scissors, white glue, markers or crayons, (optional) wiggle eyes and a pipe cleaner.

Make a $2\frac{3}{4}$ inch fold at one end of a piece of paper the landscape way. Use this fold as a guide to continue folding the paper. Now bend the folded paper from the top down. Cut on this end to make two accordion pleated halves. Glue the ends together.

On one end, which will become the cover, draw a pig as big as the paper will allow. Use this as a pattern to cut through the other pages so all are shaped like your piggie. DO NOT CUT THE FOLDS APART! Open up the accordion and see how each piece is shaped like your piggie. Make a hole in the last page to put the pipe cleaner through. Wrap the pipe cleaner around a pencil to curl it, and twist it to stay on the book. Or draw a curly pigtail and paste it on your last page. Glue a wiggly eye or draw an eye and other features on the piggie on the front cover.
